- Wikipedia: the world's largest encyclopedia
 - Over 100 languages
 - English edition: 600,000 articles
 - Korean still small: 10,240 articles
 - Written entirely by volunteers
 - Free content
 - Free to download
 - Free to distribute and modify, even sell
 - Free of advertising







From Wikipedia to Wikimedia

- 2001: Wikipedia is founded using simple wiki technology
- Rapid growth, now among 100 largest websites
- July 2003: Wikimedia Foundation is set up
 - Non-profit organization
- 2002-2004: new projects are launched
 - Wiktionary, Wikibooks, Wikiquote, Wikisource, Wikimedia Commons, Wikinews

Wikinews

- Proposed by me in October 2004, vote, demo
- Launched in December 2004 in English and German
- Other languages: Dutch, French, Spanish, Swedish, Bulgarian, Polish, Portuguese, Romanian, Ukrainian, Serbian
- Coming up: Russian, Japanese
- Minimum support for new languages: 5 people





Mission

- To report the news on any subject
- Key principles from Wikipedia:
 - Free content
 - Maximal openness
 - Neutral point of view
- Difference to Wikipedia: Original reporting explicitly allowed






The English edition

- More than 2000 articles written since launch
- Of these, 90 incorporate original reporting
- Typical Wikinews story is a synthesis of information from external sources
 - News sites
 - Background information (most frequently Wikipedia)
- Sources must be cited
- Reporters must publish their notes

Content examples


- Reports from
 - Belize (civil unrest)
 - Rwanda (genocide conference)
 - Iran (soccer unrest, via IM)
 - And most "Wikinews countries", esp. USA, Germany, Poland

Media experiments

- Video edition
 - Was piloted, but not off the ground yet
- Print edition
 - Produced daily with OpenOffice
- Audio edition
 - Produced daily
- Streaming audio (Wikinews Network)
 - Experimental stage





Problem areas

- Neutral point of view
 - May reduce incentive to contribute
 - Works well in practice
- Review
 - Reduces willingness of others to link to stories
- Usability and other technological improvements
 - Easy story writing interface
 - RSS and workflow automation





Funding free journalism

- Wikinews is **not** a company, nobody gets paid
- Distributed funding could support research
- Some contests set up and funded by the community
- Shared fund for OhMyNews, Wikinews and others?
- Wikimedia shows that donations can work





Collaboration

- Study each other's technology
- Share content to bootstrap communities
- Build communication channels for all citizen journalists
 - Instant Messaging, IRC, Skype, mailing lists
- Cooperate, don't compete :-)
- We are the new media. We make our own rules.
